

Checklist for Charleston

- *Registration up to date*
- *Routine maintenance up to date*
- *Full of fuel*
- *Electronics are working (at minimum GPS and depth sounder)*
- *GPS tracks are turned on*
- *Head holding tank (if equipped) is cleaned out, chemical and toilet paper on board*
- *Fresh water (if equipped) is full*
- *TowBoat US or SeaTow Membership is Active*
- *Equipment:*
 - *Anchor*
 - *Four dock lines (minimum)*
 - *Four fenders (minimum)*
 - *Suggested: VHF Radio (Strongly encouraged - handheld, if not installed on the boat)*
 - *Optional: Stern anchor (only if you plan to anchor your boat for the day on Saturday)*
 - *Optional: Boat cleaning equipment, hose*
- *Safety Gear:*
 - *Life jackets for everyone on board*
 - *A throwable floatation device*
 - *Flares – Check date*
 - *Fire extinguisher – Check charge*
 - *Whistle (Horn is acceptable substitute)*
- *Supplies:*
 - *Sunscreen*
 - *Rain coats*
 - *Frist aid kit*
 - *Towels*
 - *Water*
 - *Snacks*
 - *Optional: Hand sanitizer*
 - *Optional: Insect repellent*
 - *Optional: Motion sickness medicine if you have guests*
